5. Business arising from the minutes

a. Fundraising

Several fundraisers planned throughout the year will need council members to assist. Specifically, the Olympic themed A-Thon in February, the purchase of G. W. Smith Apparel, and Teacher Torture. b. ASCA Courses

c. Multi Sport Pad

Last May the Council voted to redo the southeast basketball court with a focus on redoing the asphalt, painting new lines for basketball, 4 square, badminton, new basketball backboards and possibly extending the area. One quote was garnered from approved school vendor, Border Paving, for approximately \$24000 to resurface the area. Discussion ensued regarding gathering more quotes and the need for a committee moving forward. Garth indicated he had experience and offered to help in the process. It was agreed that the city should be contacted to see if they would be willing to help as well. The goal is to have an order made for the resurfacing done by November so that it may be completed in the spring.

We can move forward on purchasing funnel ball structures. They are approximately \$750-\$800 per unit. They would be installed east of the court and do not need to be near the asphalt. Garth has volunteered to dig the holes. The committee will also pursue asking the City if they would donate the digging of the hole and concrete.

Krista made a motion to purchase and install two funnel ball structures up to a limit of \$2000. James seconded. The motion was carried.
